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INTRODUCTION

In the past, schools and **academic institutions** tended to focus on giving their students a complete and thorough education. These days, the curriculum is invariably crammed with academic subjects, and lessons in the arts have often disappeared altogether. The decision to prioritise science and social science over the arts is deeply troubling and misguided.

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The **curriculum** is a list of the subjects studied at a school, and information about exactly what each subject includes

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If something is **crammed**, it is filled so that it is completely full or even too full

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If you **prioritise** something, you decide it is the most important thing and that you must deal with it before other things

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If your decision or opinion is **misguided**, it is wrong because it is based on bad judgement or wrong information

MAIN PARAGRAPH 1

Probably the most significant reason for teaching singing, dance and painting relates to **self-expression**. Human beings desperately need to show their feelings and express their emotions. The easiest and most effective way to achieve this is through writing poetry, drawing or performing a piece of classical music on the violin. Although classes in physics or business studies can help to develop vital cognitive strategies, they do not offer youngsters the chance to explore new ways of interpreting their world.

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We can make essays cohesive by using **this** to refer back to an earlier idea

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We can represent our ideas with examples, to show the examiner we have a wide vocabulary

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We can use **although** or **even though** in sentences which express concession

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Although or even though can be followed by a subordinate clause...

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...and by a main clause which completes the complex sentence

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to **interpret** = to express/show your ideas about the meaning of something

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Connecting one main paragraph to the ideas in the previous paragraph is a good way of making your essay cohesive and coherent

MAIN PARAGRAPH 2

Connected to **this point** is the notion of balance. A person who understands everything from a scientific perspective can hardly be described as well-rounded and mature. Indeed, studies suggest that the best researchers and chief executives tend to love creative activities such as singing or sculpting. It therefore seems that studying the arts has major intellectual benefits for those who wish to be scientists or business leaders.

A **notion** is a belief or idea

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Using relative pronouns and relative clauses makes your grammar more complex

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A **perspective** is a particular way of thinking about or considering something

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We can combine modal verbs with passive forms to help make our style formal

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We can use **indeed** to add extra information which supports what we previously wrote

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We can use **such as** to add examples which strengthen our point and show our strong vocabulary

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We can use **those** with a relative pronoun/clause to refer to groups of people in detail

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If something is **overlooked**, people often fail to notice or consider it

MAIN PARAGRAPH 3

Finally, one often **overlooked** point is that children enjoy the arts. Young learners have fun developing these skills. They adore both the practical aspects of painting or singing and the more technical or theoretical elements. When academic study can be so tedious and seemingly pointless, it is essential to offer pupils something which they can be enthusiastic about.

We can use **these** with a noun to refer to something in an earlier sentence or paragraph, or to refer to something in the title

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If you **adore** something, you love it a lot

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We can often include opposites to show how strong our vocabulary is...

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Practical relates to real situations, experience, actions

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Technical relates to knowledge of machines or methods used in science or industry

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Theoretical relates to ideas and theories rather than to what happens in the real world

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Try to avoid repeating important words, especially in the same sentence

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The structure **it + to be + adjective + infinite** is very useful

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upbringing = the way you are treated and educated when young, especially by your family

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CONCLUSION

Overall, I would say that the arts should play a major role in a child's education and **upbringing**. I wholeheartedly believe that headteachers and those in charge of learning ought to ensure that subjects which develop creativity and imagination can be found on every pupil's timetable.

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A **timetable** is a detailed plan which shows the times and locations of a pupil's lessons

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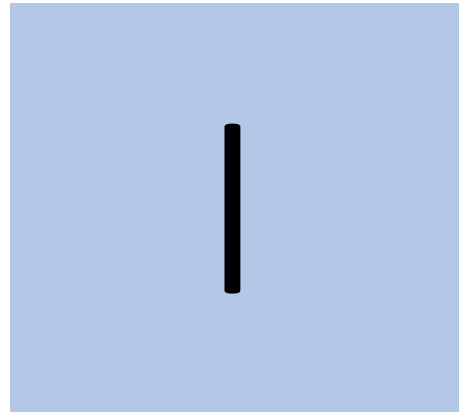
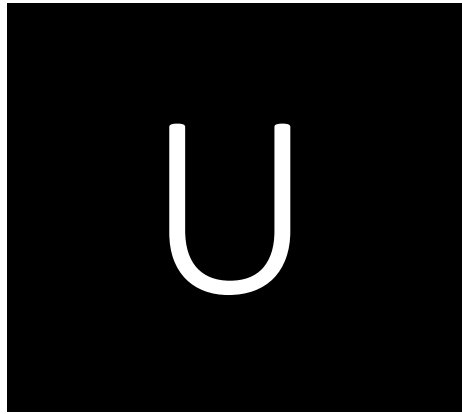
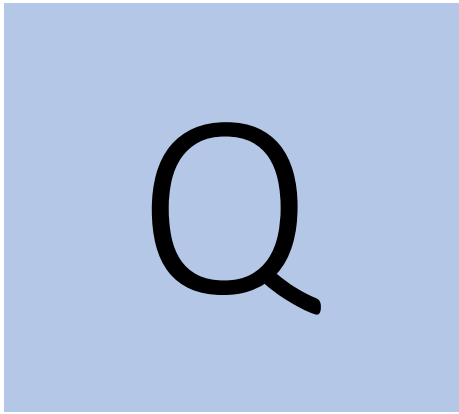
